Minutes of the meeting of State Road Safety Council held on 8th December, 2025 at 2.00 P.M. in the Assam Water Centre, FREMAA, Basistha, Guwhati-22.

The 2nd meeting of the State Road Safety Council of the calendar year 2025 was held under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of Transport, Govt. of Assam on 8th December, 2025 at 2.00 P.M. in the Assam Assam Water Centre, FREMAA, Basistha, Guwhati-22.

At the outset, Assistant Commissioner of Transport, Assam welcomed all the members present and explained the objective of the meeting.

Thereafter, the Additional Secretary to the Govt. of Assam, Transport Department and Head of the Lead Agency, State Road Safety, Assam presented a brief presentation on the powers and functions of the State Road Safety Council, Status of present Road Safety scenario, different Road Safety activities carried out in the State.

Then action taken by the different stakeholders on the basis of previous resolutions were discussed in details. The following issues were discussed with active involvement of all the members present and various resolutions/decisions arrived at.

In the last meeting NHIDCL was directed to expedite the process for carrying out the third party Road Safety Audit in the entire land as mentioned in their status report in this regard by September, 2025. The meeting was informed that Road Safety Audit reports of the completed stretches have been submitted to the Lead Agency vide email dated 08.05.2025. 3rd Party Road Safety Auditors have been engaged and the audits are underway. The final audit reports shall be submitted to the Lead Agency once they are completed.

The NHIDCL was directed to expedite the process of 3rd Party Audit and submit the final Audit report to the Lead Agency on Road Safety at the earliest.

PWD (ROADS)

In the last meeting held on 26.06.2025, the PWD (Roads) was directed to furnish a report regarding utilization of services of Road Safety Auditors trained at IIT Guwahati for conducting audit at completed/ ongoing/ work zones and Road Safety Audit reports. Further it is also directed to submit a report on incorporation of Road Safety Surveys in the preparation of DPR. The meeting was informed that all Road Safety Auditors trained at IIT-G are presently being engaged in auditing stretches in front of institutions like schools, Hospitals etc. and also other Roads under Divisional jurisdictions. They are to submit reports to the concerned EEs which will be incorporated in DPRs. All Executive Engineers of all division already instructed to incorporate Road Safety Audit Surveys in the preparation of DPR. Moreover, Road vigilance committees have been instituted in every division office for ensuring road

In this context, the council directed the PWD (Roads) to observe all necessary formalities and submit a report to Lead Agency on Road Safety along with a list of the trained Road Safety Auditors .DRSCs to review the performance of Road Safety Auditors and submit a report in this regard. The meeting also directed to ensure that there shouldn't be any vacancy of such trained personal while transferring.

In the last meeting held on 26 June, 2025, the PWD (Roads) was directed to submit assessment report on Improvements in Black Spots where long term measures are implemented. The meeting was informed that there has been approximately 58% and 60% reduction in accidents in fatalities respectively.

Further, the council directed the PWD (Roads) to submit a report on the steps taken for long term measures at the remaining black spots in coordination with their efforts to take steps for immediate installation of adequate signages, especially at construction sites with regular reporting to Head of Lead Agency & DRSC. The meeting was informed that, Long term road safety measures are implemented in all 33 blackspots, 12 blackspots under Jalukbari and Hajo TRD in Kamrup Rural district are handed over to PWD NH and rest 21 nos. of blackspots are presently under PWD(Roads).

The Council discussed the matter relating to Budget Proposal for Road Safety Fund for the FY 2025-26. The council was informed that for the FY 2025-26 the total budgeted amount is Rs.1373.92 Lakhs. Out of this budgeted amount, FOC for Rs.400 Lakhs (FOC for Rs.200 Lakhs against the budget provision of Rs.950.00 Lakhs under Assam Motor Vehicle Road Safety cess and FOC for Rs.200 Lakhs against the budget provision of Rs.423.95 Lakhs only under Assam Motor Vehicle Road Safety Compounding Fee) has been received.

The different Heads where the budgeted amount is proposed to be incurred was also presented in the SRSC meeting as mentioned below:

- a. Engagement of IT Expert, Procurement Expert and IT Engineer-Rs 44.00 Lakh
- b. Electronic Enforcement and monitoring-Rs 991.92 Lakh
- c. Hiring of Vehicles for officials of Road safety Lead Agency-Rs.90.00 Lakh

collaborating with the International Centre for Automotive Technology (ICAT) to conduct an intensive Audit of Vehicles Transporting School Children, following ICAT's strong interest in the survey. To initiate this, a directive was sent to all Inspectors of Schools on August 15, 2025, requesting their views and comments. In response, field offices not only expressed interest but also submitted comprehensive replies identifying high-risk School Zones, designating treatment areas linked to child fatalities, and providing district-level action plans focused on awareness, all based on the guidelines set forth in The Assam Road Safety Action Plan revised by Save life Foundation.

All Inspectors of Schools were directed to designate trained Nodal Teachers/Officers at school and district levels to manage Road Safety and School Zone Treatment according to IRC standards and The Assam Road Safety Action Plan. These officers received one-day virtual training focused on crash handling, site identification, and fatality mitigation, with their contact details documented and submitted to the O/o Commissionerate of Transport.

Accident data analysis

While reviewing the district wise accident data analysis presented by Head of Lead Agency on Road Safety, the meeting emphasized on the need to cause district wise analysis regarding the reasons for increase/decrease of road accident and fatalities across the State. The meeting observed that there has been increased in Road Accidents and fatalities during 6:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. on National Highways as per data available w.e.f. January, 2025

The meeting decided that the State Road Safety Council shall direct all the District Road Safety Committees (DRSCs) to cause an analysis regarding the reasons for increase/decrease of road accident and fatalities in their jurisdiction and submit a report in this regard. The meeting also decided that based on the report, the target for reduction in road accident and fatalities

d. Awareness and IEC Activities-Rs. 200.00 Lakh

e. Miscellaneous expenses-Rs. 48.00 Lakh

The Council was also informed that at present the total unspent amount up to the previous financial year lying in the Road Safety Fund bank account is Rs. 2302.24 lakhs for which concurrence from the Finance Department is still awaited.

Henceforth the total unspent amount lying in the Road Safety Bank account is Rs. 2702.24 lakhs.

The Council decided that out of this fund, the expenditure on the following Head is to be incurred-

- a. Remuneration of it expert, procurement expert and IT Engineer up to the month of March, 2026 which is expected to be Rs. 44 lakhs (Approx).
- b. Bill for Procurement, Maintenance of interceptor vehicles and calibration of breath analyzers up to the month of March, 2026 which is expected to be Rs. 80 lakhs (Approx).
- c. Payment for portable weigh in motion (W.I.M) device to monitor overloading of vehicles on rental basis which is Rs. 33 Lakhs (Approx)..
- d. Amount for hiring of vehicles for officials of Road Safety Lead Agency up to the month of March, 2026 which is expected to be Rs. 90 lakhs (Approx).

The Council revisited the budget proposal passed by it in June 2025 in view of the changed dynamics and meeting milestones under SASCI Scheme (Part VI B), additional 14-15 Crores INR will be needed to implement ITMS in remaining locations in 4 districts of Assam. Accordingly it was decided to divert INR 4.5 Crores from head "Engagement of Agency for Automated AI monitoring for Municipal, Traffic and Driver Compliance using AI Powered Devices in Public Sector Vehicles" and additional INR 4.5 Crores from "Engagement of Agency for Automated Driving Testing Track in the State of Assam" and use the same for implementation of SASCI Scheme in addition with whatever is remaining from the earlier earmarked INR 9.91 Crore (Approx). It is to be mentioned that GANM India Impex has already been granted the work order for supply of Dashboard Camera, Body Worn Camera System and Laser Speed meter for various districts of Assam for Rs. 4,75,43,936.00.

The Council also decided that an amount of Rs.50 lakhs is to be kept for the Engagement of Agency for automated driving testing track in the state of Assam.

The rest of the amount which is Rs. 55 Lakhs (Approx) can be used for various miscellaneous Road Safety activities.

The Commissioner & Secretary, Govt. of Assam, Transport Department, expressed concerns over menace of road accidents and fatalities in the State and stated that a lot needs to be done to minimize the road accidents and fatalities in the days to come. Accordingly, the Commissioner & Secretary, Transport Department urged all stakeholders to take the road safety as a challenge and focus should be given for close co-ordination among the 4Es i.e. Education, Emergency, Engineering and Enforcement.

The Hon'ble Minister of Transport and Chairman, SRSC in his concluding remarks urged the Stakeholder Agencies/ Departments to make all out efforts to work for the safety of all road users in accordance with the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety, guidelines issued by Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) and with a vision of "No life Loss". He stated that there are still a lot of works/ activities to be executed/ implemented for improvement of Road Safety scenario in the State and also urged the all Stakeholders to observe the ensuing National Road Safety month from 1st Jan to 31st Jan, 2026 in a successful manner. The Hon'ble Minister, Transport also urged that an action plan for the forthcoming National Road Safety Month be devised and circulated to all the District Commissioners.

The Hon'ble Minister, Transport, Assam urged the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI), NHIDCL to work hard for reduction of road accidents on the National Highways. He expressed his gratitude towards all the officials of the Stakeholder Agencies/ Departments for taking various measures on Road Safety in the State. The Hon'ble Minister of Transport, Assam also urged all the Stakeholder Agencies/ Departments to make a coordinated management/ endeavor for carrying out the Road Safety activities in a befitting manner in the State.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks from the Chair.
